Minor protections as default if no age assurance Not liable if conduct commercially reasonable age assurance

Self declared age


Age estimation to a reasonable certainty based on risk

Age verification based on government ID Age verification based on biometric match


Age verification to accuracy threshold (95%)

# Other Parental Rights



### Examples of Well-Being Standards

- Prohibitions
- The business knows/ has reason to know/ willfully disregards
- Materially detrimental/ substantial harm
- To minor's physical or mental health/ well-being/ privacy

#### Affirmative obligations

- To use reasonable care to avoid heightened risk of harm caused by service
- To make commercially reasonable effort to prevent or mitigate exposure to harmful content
- To develop and implement strategy to prevent exposure to harmful content
- To ensure best interests of children

# Minor Protection By Design

1 "High" Privacy Settings By Default	Restrictions on search engine indexing of profiles
2 Account visibility and content sharing limits	6 Limits on precise geolocation
Restrictions of personalization of default content feed	Restrictions on viewing of likes or other forms of feedback
Screen time limits, notification time limits, and scheduled breaks	8 Restrictions on Direct Messaging and Chat

Restrictions on autoplay, infinite scroll, or livestreams


